The Late Mrs. Elizabeth Smith, Aged Seventy-six Years. Ardoch, Jan. 30.—Death visited the home of Mrs. Alice Gray at an early hour Friday morning, Jan. 20th, and claimed her aged mother, Mrs. Elizabeth Smith, who was in her seventy-sixth year. The deceased had been in failing health for the past few months, due to infirmities, but the immediate cause of her demise was a paralytic stroke. The late Mrs. Smith, whose maiden name was Elizabeth Tyner, was born in Tamworth and wed to Charles Smith. Fifty-four years ago they moved to this place, braving the hardships of a pioneer's life. Kind deeds and actions won for them many friends who now sadly miss the faces of this venerable couple. Mr. Smith having passed to his eternal reward eight years ago. Six children were born of this union, all of whom survive. They are: Mrs. George Hamilton, Mrs. Alice Gray, John and Charles all of this place, and Mrs. George Young and Mrs. John Gray of Merrickville and Harlowe, respectively. The late Mrs. Smith also leaves two brothers, Thomas, Beaver Falls, N.Y., and John, Tamworth.

deceased will be greatly missed as she was a diligent and faithful worker. The funeral services were conducted Sunday afternoon at St. John's church, Ardoch, Rev. J. Cantrell, Sharbot Lake, officiating. The remains, borne by her two sons, John and Charles, two sons-in-law, George Hamilton and John Gray, and two grandsons, Roy Hamilton and Samuel Gray, were then placed in their rest resting place in the family plot in the Anglican cemetery.

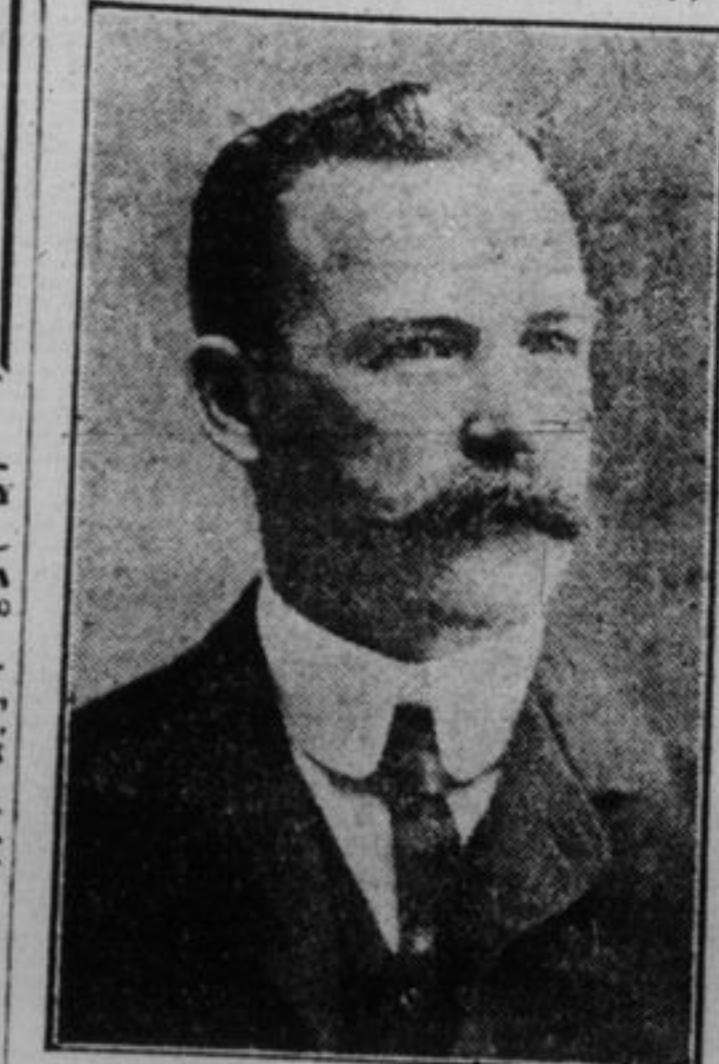
