LENINE WAS MISTAKEN

RUSSIAN LEADER ADMITS HIS ECONOMIC DEFEAT.

He Does Not Think That Attempts to Abolish Capitalism Can Prove Successful, But He Intends to Keep Up Struggle — Bolsheviks Are Still Willing to Sacrifice Their Unfortunate Country.

In a recent address, Lenin admitted the failure of Russia to abolish capitalism, and announced a reaction toward individual property rights and free trade, at least for the peasants. His acknowledgment of defeat is reiterated, but one quotation will suffice: "We suffered an economic defeat on the economic front, and the defeat was very severe."

But it was necessary to permit ownership in farm products, and that could only be realized by authorizing sale and exchange of the New York Times. This statement of production was universally necessary, and "we have not known how to do it.
