## AUSTRALIA IS READY FOR RECIPROCAL PACT

With Canada, According to Word Received by the Dominion Government.

Ottawa, Feb. 9.—Intimation has been received by the Dominion government that the government of Australia is ready to negotiate a reciprocal arrangement with Canada, and developments along that line are for discussion within a few weeks. Canada and New Zealand have exchanged preferences already, but a reciprocal arrangement with Australia has long been detained, pending the revision of the tariff. The balance of the tariff is largely in favor of Canada at present, exports to Australia materially exceeding imports. The new Australian tariff, however, has its Canadian exporters, while most of the imports from that Dominion are either on the free list or at a very low tariff rate. Communications looking to a new agreement are in the hands of the minister of finance.

## Standard Fire Assurance Building, Montreal, Burned

Montreal, Feb. 9.—A terrific outbreak of fire early this morning destroyed the Standard Fire Assurance company building, 157 St. James street, in the heart of the business district, causing damages estimated at \$1,000,000, with an insurance of six hundred thousand dollars.

## British Indian Force Fires On Mob of 10,000 Natives

London, Feb. 9.—A British Indian police force on a mob of ten thousand natives during a serious riot at Tiruvannamalai, about eighty-five miles southwest of Madras in Tanjore Tuesday last, killing three and wounding eight, says a despatch from Madras.

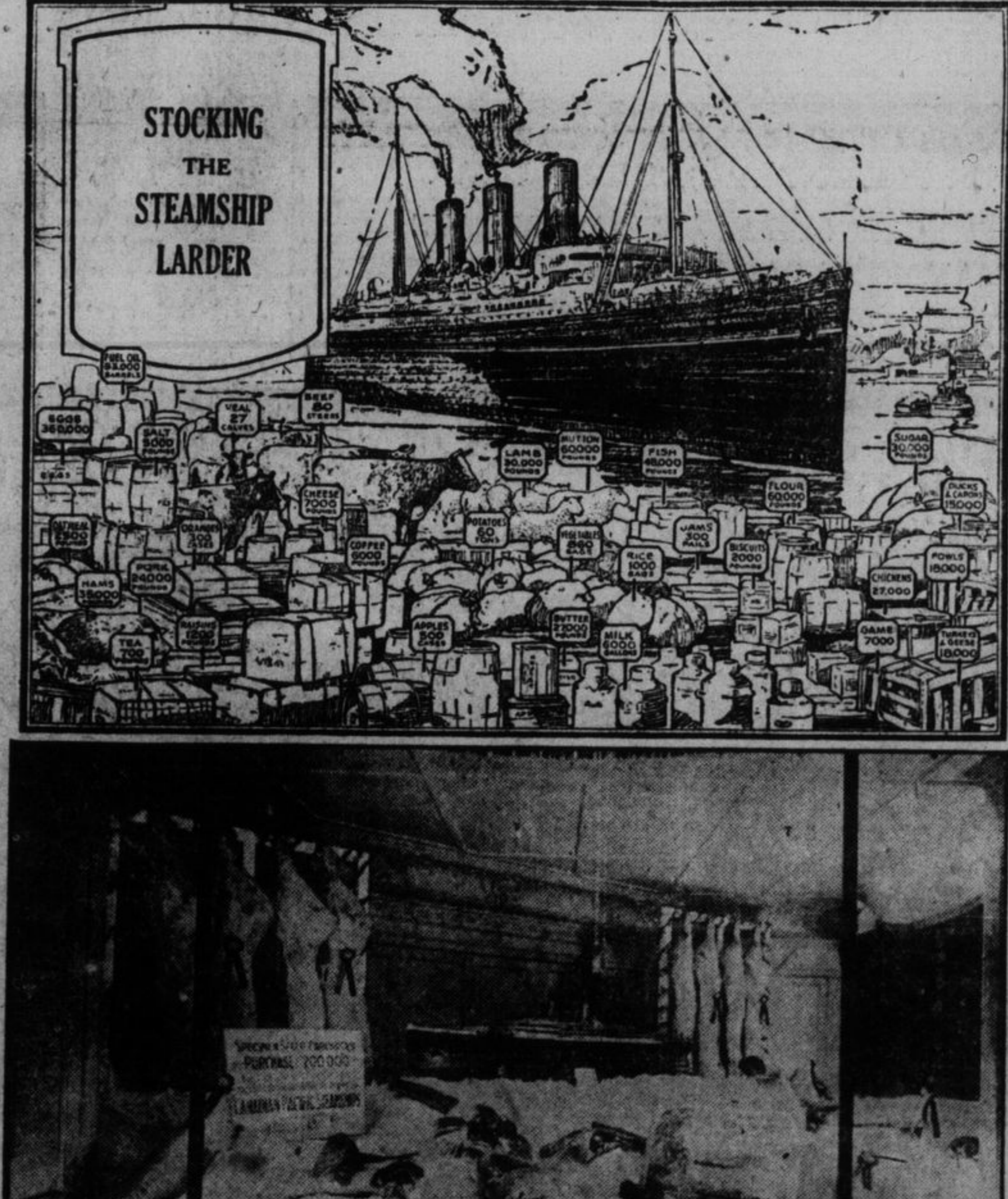

Moscow, Feb. 9.—All the Russian Cheka, a Soviet secret police and judicial organization, maintained largely for suppression of counter revolutions, has been abolished.

Recently prize beef was placed on exhibition in Almy's window, near St. Alexander Street, Montreal, purchased at the Toronto Christmas Show for use on the forthcoming cruises of the C.P.S.I. Steamers "Empress of France," "Empress of Scotland," and "Empress of Britain." It was arranged by the Canadian Pacific Steamships Ltd. The carcasses, all Canadian raised stock are of exceptional quality.

For three cruises the requirements in beef are approximately 175,000 pounds, or in other terms 225 choice steer carcasses with a dressed weight of 750 lbs. each.
