For a string quartette to achieve fame is a much more difficult thing than for a violin virtuoso or for an orchestra, according to Adopho Betti leader of the Flonzaley Quartette. The obstacles to be overcome, asserts Mr. Betti, are none the less real for being more subtle and intangible.

"The reason successful quartettes are rarer than orchestras or soloists of the same celebrity," explains the Flonzaleys' distinguished first violin, "lies in the peculiar character of chamber-music. The quartette form is at once intricate and delicate, perhaps the most exacting of all in its demands. Not possessing the weight of tone and mass of color always at the command of the orchestra, the quartette is also without certain advantages which the solo performer enjoys.
