SUNDAY SALE OF WINE MAY CEASE IN QUEBEC

Government Sale of Liquor Urged in New Brunswick by Chief Inspector.

Quebec, March 13.—Sunday selling of wines and beers may be totally prohibited in the province of Quebec. Hon. Jacob Nicol, provincial treasurer, has this in mind at present in addition to the bill he is bringing in shortly to amend the act of licensing. There is a question of permitting the hotels to sell to guests on Sundays at the restaurants, but the argument against this is that it might be called class legislation.

Government Sale Urged, Fredericton, N.B., March 13.

The first report of John B. Hawthorne as chief inspector under the Intoxicating Liquor Act, covering the year ending October 31st, 1921, was presented in the legislature Saturday by Hon. H. C. Robinson, as acting provincial secretary and treasurer, and includes a recommendation that "the government take over the control of all sales of intoxicating liquor within the province." The report shows a total of six hundred and eighty prosecutions during the year, there being 591 convictions and 89 dismissals.

A FRIEND OF TAYLOR ALSO A MURDER VICTIM

John T. Brunen, Theatrical Promoter, Mysteriously Shot in the Neck.

Camden, N.J., March 13.—Under mysterious circumstances, recalling the murder of Wm. Desmond Taylor, John T. Brunen, a theatrical promoter and friends of the Los Angeles director, was slain here Friday night.

Three men were seen to drive up to his home, and later he was found dead. A charge of buchshot had been fired into the back of his neck, apparently from a sawed off shotgun.

Brunen was found some time after one of the three men was seen to enter his home. No shot was heard by the neighbors, and the men had plenty of time to get away.

The slain theatrical man had been seated near a window reading an account of the trial of Mrs. Madalynne Obenchain for the murder of J. Belmont Kennedy.

Foster's Weather Bulletin.

Washington, D.C., March 13.—The week centering on March 17th will average above normal temperatures to the far north. The high temperature of that disturbance will be in North-Western Canada about March 15th, and all along meridian 90 March 17th, and in eastern sections March 19th. A cool wave will be in North-Western Canada near March 19th, on meridian 90 March 21st, eastern sections March 23rd.

Unusually severe storms will prevail from March 11th to 19th and whatever relief that is in store for America and Canada may be expected during that ten days. March will be full of storms and improvements in crop-weather will come with the storms.

Proud of Quebec's Boozing Laws.

Quebec, March 13.—So great has been the success of the Quebec Liquor Act that other provinces in Canada will soon follow the Quebec system, and not only will the system be followed in Canada, but also in the United States, declared Hon. L. A. Taschereau, premier of the province of Quebec, in the house debate.

"The example of Quebec will be followed not only in Canada, but also in the United States. There are now agents of the United States in Quebec to study the system."
