AN ESCOTT MAN 104 YEARS OLD

Patrick Smith is the Oldest Resident of Eastern Ontario.

Patrick Smith, who resides near the village of Escott, which is about three miles west of the village of Mallorytown on the main provincial highway between Kingston and Brockville, was 104 years of age on Friday, March 17th.

Mr. Smith was born in Ireland in 1818, and came to Canada when fifteen years of age. He remembers the trip across the ocean which took eight weeks and three days.

Mr. Smith does not feel any older than he did when he was seventy-five years of age. He is a very remarkable man in the fact that he has very few grey hairs and eats and sleeps well.

When Mr. Smith arrived in Canada he proceeded on the St. Lawrence river and then reached the village of Brockville where there were very few houses and later went to Lyn where he worked for eighteen years and later to the village of Escott and has resided there ever since.

Mr. Smith was twice married. His first wife died forty-eight years ago. There were three children by the first marriage, and six children by the second marriage.

Mr. Smith claims that the Whig is the best family paper that entered his home and he had been reading it for nearly seventy years.
