VICIOUS DOGS AT LARGE

Two Attack a Citizen on Street Without Any Provocation Whatever.

A number of complaints have been made recently regarding some vicious dogs around the city and several citizens have had trouble with certain snarling and biting canines of the streets. One particular case occurred near the Hooper and Slater factory on King street a few days ago, when a good-sized dog crept behind a pedestrian on the sidewalk, and without any provocation, whatever, bit the man in the calf of his leg. Not satisfied with this, the dog deliberately came back to the attack, and its barking and snarling brought another to its aid, when the two dogs staged a real offensive. The citizen tripped on the sidewalk, while defending himself, and narrowly escaped serious hurts when the two animals jumped at him with mouths open. The man finally got his back against an adjacent signboard, and by use of his feet managed to fight off the attack, until two other men appeared on the scene, when the dogs sneaked away.

This incident might easily have ended with very serious consequences, especially if the victim had been a child, with no means of defence. The canines were as persistent as a pack of wolves in the wilds, and even they seldom attack a man unless very hungry. The citizen was greatly surprised at the attack, and stated that he had never heard of a similar case.

Another young man had the misfortune to lose most of his trousers recently when a large collie attacked him, in a "rear-guard action" near the city park on King street. Dogs of this nature shouldn't be allowed at large, as if they are left to roam the streets, some day they will take it into their ugly heads to pick on some child, and then a tragedy will be the result. Everyone is familiar with the dog who bites, when provoked, and it is his one and only means of defence, but an attack of the above nature, is too much out of the ordinary to be allowed to go on, and Mr. Dog should be brought to account for his savage misdeeds.
