Rebukes Religious Propaganda.
During the course of his sermon in Chalmers church on Sunday morning, Rev. Dr. R. J. Wilson referred to the widespread propaganda with regard to scripture interpretation. He said it was not in the interests of the Gentiles—the great mass outside the church, nor of the backsliders, nor of the pagans who had not heard the gospel. It was for the sole purpose of proselytizing. The Christian church is too busy to engage in a campaign of wrangling. There is too much for it to do in striving to bring the world to Christ. Dr. Wilson, in speaking of the Lord's second coming, presented the view that His second coming would be as quiet as His first coming when he appeared upon the earth as a humble carpenter. In the evening Dr. Wilson concluded his series on the life of Christ, speaking on "Jesus and Liberty."
