YALE WINS INTERNATIONAL BOXING, TAKING THREE TO QUEEN'S TWO BOUTS

Yale University boxing team won the international boxing tournament from Queen's at the Jock Hartly Arena on Saturday night, taking three bouts to the two victories of the Queen's mittmen.

Two exhibition bouts preceded the main attractions and the boxing in the first event of the evening, put on by Howard and Tkachyk, both of Queen's was better than some of the decision affairs.

115 Pound Bout. The first international event was at 115 lbs., between Lavietes, a long-legged lad with a hard punch, representing Yale, and "Stubby" Holmes, intercollegiate 118 lb. champion.

126 Pound Even. Rose, of Yale, and MacMillan, of Queen's, entered the ring next in the 126 lb. class.

145 Pound Scrap Good. Cary, of Yale, and Roberts, of Queen's staged one of the best scraps of the evening in the 145 lb. class.

Yale Acting Captain Defeated. The surprise of the evening came when Boutt, acting captain of the Yale team, was defeated by Hanna, one of Queen's recruits this year, in the 158 lb. boxing.

Powers, an M.A.A.A. man with the Queen's team, put on an exhibition with Dibble, of Yale, in the 175 lb. class. It was a semi-burlesque affair, and it was apparent that Powers could have won easily had he so chosen.

also of R.M.C., officiated as judges. E. O. Sitter acted as timekeeper. "Billie" Hughes was given a special ovation for the work of his team, and "Bob" Anderson also came in for a share of the cheering.

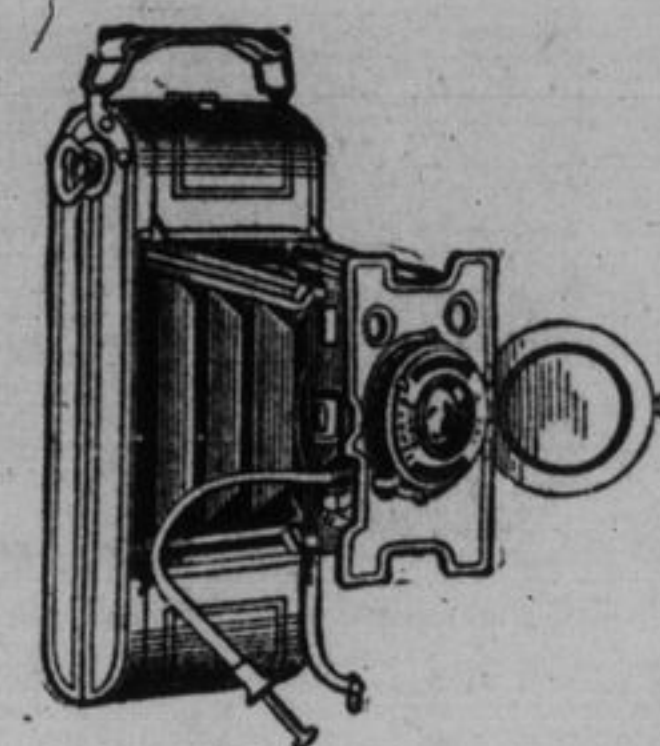

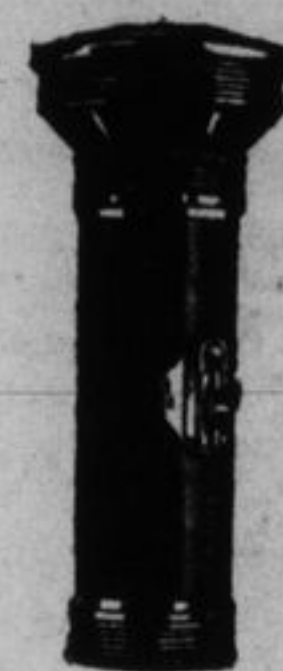
