HON. DR. BELAND REPLIES TO MISS AGNES McPHAIL. The Woman Member's First Speech in Commons in Form of Question.

Ottawa, March 28.—Woman's voice was heard for the first time in the Canadian House of Commons last night. Miss Agnes McPhail spoke about a hundred words. Her rising to, ask a question on the estimates concerning the salaries of the official of the Soldiers' Civil Re-establishment Department was sudden and conspicuous by reason of her restraint, which stands out like a beacon among the Progressive members.

It was peculiarly fitting that her first question should be asked of the gallant Hon. Dr. Beland, and gallantly the doctor rose to the occasion. As Miss McPhail rose to address the Chairman while the House was in Committee of the Whole all parties started to applaud. Miss McPhail upheld her past political utterances as the champion of the small-paid individual. "Why should the biggest paid officials get the biggest increase?" she asked.

"It is an honor to have drawn first the only lady member into discussion," said Dr. Beland, and the House applauded. "I will do my utmost to reply satisfactorily to the gracefully asked question." Whereupon the minister explained that the increases were in accord with the Civil Service Act, which made its increases along the lines Miss McPhail questioned.

Toronto, March 28.—Free text books for the school children of Ontario, is an objective within measurable distance of attainment. In the face of an almost solid opposition from the U.F.O. benches, the House yesterday gave second reading to a bill that aims to make the supplying of free text books compulsory upon all school boards, instead of optional as it is in the law at present.

The victory of the advocates of free text books was made possible by the union of the Liberals and Conservatives with the unopposed support of the Labor members. When the matter came to a vote, Mr. Raney rose to point out that the bill would be open to amendment in committee. It apparently was intended as the consent of the government that the bill should get second reading but in view of the fact that all the government members who were behind the premier, voted against it, the consent was of doubtful value.

R. Tuite, Belleville, Is Dead. Belleville, Ont., March 28.—Robert Tuite, of this city, died Sunday night after a brief illness. Deceased was sixty-seven years of age, and was born in this city, where he had resided all his life. For a number of years he was a member of the Belleville fire department. He was a member of the A. O. U. W. Society. In politics he was a Conservative. A widow, three sons and one daughter survive.

Ernest A. Jose, of this city, died Monday in his fifty-sixth year. Deceased was a member of the Presbyterian church and a member of the Belleville Lodge, A.F. & A.M., and L. O. L. No. 2519. Deceased was a bachelor.

Held on Burglary Charge. Belleville, Ont., March 28.—On Thursday night last John Shiers' general store at Tamworth, was burglarized, when \$15 in money and a considerable quantity of merchandise was taken. High County Constable Breen, Lennox, with the assistance of the Belleville police, has recovered some of the goods taken and also arrested Percy and Fred DeLine, carrying Place, charging them with the offence. The accused were taken to Napane for trial. Both are young men and are brothers.
