EFFECTS OF WAR STRAIN.

Every day brings new evidences of the effects of war upon the men and officers who served overseas. Many of them were pronounced as physically fit when discharged from the army, but later on disorders of various natures developed.

One of the outstanding features discovered is the effect upon blood pressure among those subjected to extraordinary nerve strain, a perceptible increase in those of forty-five years or older and an equally pronounced lowering of blood pressure among the younger officers.

Until the exact explanation for these effects are found and curative means discovered, the examining surgeons fear the conclusion must be that the war's effects have permanently blasted thousands who endured the inevitable nerve strain which accompanied the greater number of the war's operations.
