COMPLAINTS ARE LODGED

Against Local Children's Aid Society Which Will Demand Specific Charges.

There was a special meeting of the Children's Aid Society executive on Thursday afternoon, called for the purpose of dealing with complaints lodged against the local society by Provincial Superintendent Kelso. The representatives of the press were asked to retire after the proceedings were fairly started.

The whole affair is only a development of the circumstances brought to light at the previous meeting of the society held last week when Inspector John Pollie proffered his resignation, but which was not accepted, pending communication with Toronto respecting the stoppage of the Inspector's salary. The superintendent's contention is not accepted by the officers of the society here, and it is understood that they will demand the production of specific charges upon which the action of the Toronto office is based.

Dr. W. W. Sands, secretary of the Children's Aid Society, declared that the statements made in the superintendent's letter were not true. "I do not think we should do anything unless the superintendent makes specific charges against this society," he said.

It is contended by some members that the whole trouble is the work of former members of the Children's Aid Society and dates from the time the society was reorganized some years ago and the former agent was dismissed.

"Ever since that time certain individuals in Kingston have been looking for some grounds upon which to cause a rupture in the harmonious relations existing between the local society and the Toronto authorities," they say. It is contended that the local work is well done and that wards of the society were well cared for.
