
## TO UNTRUE THINKING

### "WITCH DOCTOR" HELD WHITE WOMAN CAPTIVE

Threat of "Voodoo" Kept Her For Eight Years in Negro's Home.

Pittsburgh, Pa., April 3 .- Spurious diamonds dangling from his ears, garbed in a swallow-tailed coat and wearing a white vest, Henry Washington, negro voodoo specialist, Saturday told Magistrate Tensard De Wolfe how he held Mrs. Charlotte Wyles, 45, a white woman, captive in his home for nearly eight years. It is alleged he made her believe she would be seized by his voodoo

Washington's supernatural powers held no terror for Magistrate De Wolfe and Henry was held on several charges, including cruelty and neglect. His wife, children and Mrs. Wyles were taken in charge by social welfare agents. Mrs. Wyles refused to talk. Her emaciated appearance gave evidence of her balf-starved condition. Police expressed the beief that brutal treatment which she had suffered during her long confinement had unbalanced her mind.

It is through the efforts of relatives that police traced her and rescued her, She fought police. She had resigned herself to her fate and the doctrine of voodooism had taken root. She did not want to leave.
