**Most Amazing Robbery In New York City**

New York, April 4.—Five burglars invaded the fashionable home of Albert R. Shattuck, 19 Washington Square north, yesterday. They captured the entire household, consisting of Mr. and Mrs. Shattuck and eight servants, and thrust them into a wine cellar. They then ransacked the house, carrying off \$100,000 worth of jewellery after an exciting chase that threw Greenwich village into a state of wild excitement.  
One fugitive was captured after a desperate encounter with the police. He had \$20,000 worth of loot in his possession. Although subjected to a severe grilling, the prisoner has refused to give any information concerning his associates in one of the most sensational crimes the police have been confronted with in years.

According to the best available information, three of the burglars entered the old-fashioned mansion of the north side of the square shortly after five o'clock in the morning. There was no evidence discovered that indicated they forced their way in. The police are working on the theory that someone supplied them with a pass key for the front door. Somewhere in the spacious mansion they hid themselves.
