THE BAND OF GYPSIES ORDERED OUT OF CITY

The Police Gave Them Their "Marching Orders" on Tuesday Afternoon.

The band of gypsies who were corralled by the Kingston police on Tuesday afternoon, are "on their way."

In other words, they were given their "marching orders" by the police, and sent on their way out the York road.

The three men, one woman and a boy, taken into custody by Constables Leslie Clark and Leslie Armstrong early in the afternoon, were held at the police station for a short time, and while they were there, Constables Armstrong and Clark, with Provincial Constable Clark, paid a visit to the camp of the gypsies, near Barrieffs, and gave orders for the members of the camp to "move on" and at the same time directed them out to the York road. Then the gypsies taken to the police station were also sent on their way, and the police squad stayed with the gypsies until they were well on their way, and made sure that they did not turn back towards the city.

A Princess street merchant, charged the gypsy "queen" with stealing \$4. One of the men in the party gave the merchant this amount and no charge was made against her in the police court.
