### Efficient Housekeeping

An Old Fashioned "Boiled Dinner." At this season of the year—the transition period between the cold and warm weather—the appetite is apt to flag unless two rules are followed: 1. Serve lighter meats rather than the heavy, red-blooded meats, except once or twice a week. 2. Serve foods attractively, to tempt the appetite.

Today I am going to suggest a menu to illustrate the first rule; and next Monday I shall publish an article The Simple Garnishing of Food, which will help the housekeeper to observe the second rule.

"Boiled Dinner." Coffee. Apple Sauce Topped with Meringue. Boiled Dinner: Put four pounds of corned beef over the fire to boil in water to cover. Do this at 7 o'clock in the morning if you have dinner at noon. At the same time put six beets on to boil, in a separate pot, but after one hour take them out and put them into the pot which contains the corned beef. Cut a small head of cabbage in quarters and let it soak in cold water for one hour; at ten o'clock put the cabbage into a clean cheesecloth bag and add it to the meat pot, but at 11:30 o'clock take it out to drain in a colander. Peel and slice a few turnips and a few carrots and put these into the kettle at 11 o'clock and let boil until 12. The potatoes, too, should go into the kettle with the corned beef in time to be done for a twelve-sharp-dinner. A few minutes before serving reheat the cabbage by putting it back into the pot with the other vegetables. Serve in a large tureen or vegetable dish.

To Make the Meringue for the Apple Sauce: Beat one egg-white stiff, sweeten it with a little granulated sugar, and stiffen it by also beating into it a few teaspoons of any kind

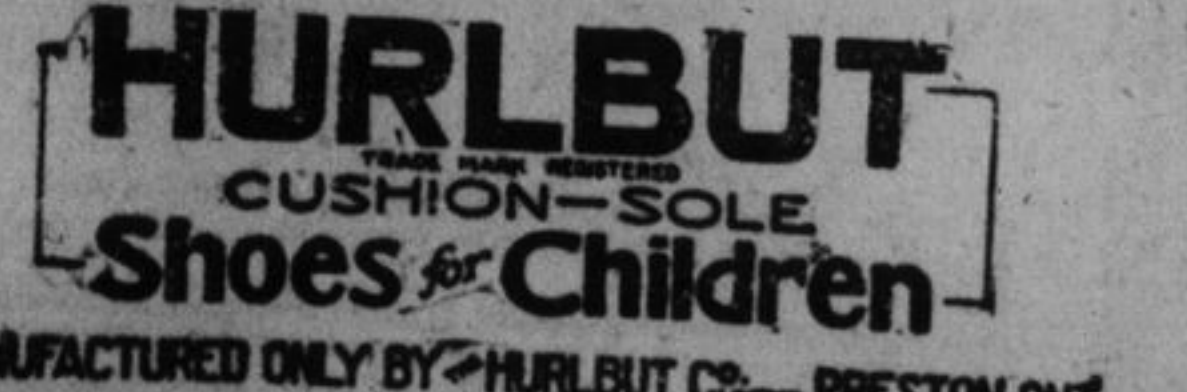
