The games will be played on the beautiful Bagatelle grounds on the Bois du Boulogne.

Two in One. The Crystal Palace Arena, London, England, which seats 100,000 persons, has been engaged by a syndicate which hopes to stage two bouts during the stay in England of Jack Dempsey, champion heavyweight boxer of the world. George McDonald, promoter, is proposing that Dempsey undertake to finish Joe Beckett, English heavyweight champion, in six rounds, and Jack Blumenfeld in four. Seat prices will range from six shillings to five pounds sterling.

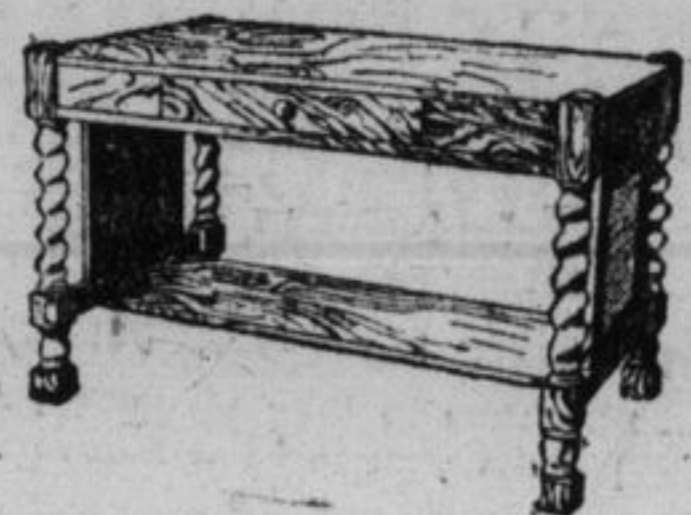
