AURA LEE, O.H.A. OLUB AND EXECUTIVE OUT

Drastic Action by O.A.A.U. of C. Following Definite Charges.

As a result of definite charges which are considered as substantiated, the registration committee of the Ontario Branch Amateur Athletic Union at a special meeting, decided to cancel the amateur cards of all members of the Aura Lee Senior O. H. A. Hockey Team, and also place under suspension the Executive Officers of the Senior O. H. A. Club.

The charges were made personally before the committee and corroborated by others within the past few days. The committee have been investigating for some time the activities of this club, with the result that they are at last in a position of having definite charges made, and have secured valuable information pertaining to same.

An opportunity will be given those under suspension who desire it, and feel they can justify themselves in the eyes of the Registration Committee, to have a hearing at the next meeting of the committee called for May 16th.

MORVICH GOES SOUTH.

If Derby Winner May Be Sent to Stud. Morvich, last year's champion of the two-year-olds, has started in his specially designed private car for a regal express ride to Louisville to be made fit for the Kentucky Derby.

If Morvich wins the Derby and shows exceptional mettle in other distance events, such as the Lantonia \$50,000 race for 3-year-olds, the Dyer Stakes at Aqueduct and the two fall events, the Jockey Club Stakes and the Saratoga Cup probably sandwiched in, Trainer Fred Burlew will recommend to Mr. Block that Morvich be retired to the stud.

"If Morvich proves in the Kentucky Derby that he is not a quitter, and that he can carry over a distance and ground the speed which made him the unquestioned champion of last year, it will be my wish that he be allowed to retire to the stud as a champion, without being subject to racing under the crushing weight that the handicapper inevitably will impose upon so great a horse," Burlew was quoted as saying today. Mr. Block said that he has not made any definite plans for the horse's future, and Burlew, in his interview, was represented as giving only his own views. Burlew will accompany Morvich to Louisville tomorrow.

If Morvich were retired to the stud Mr. Block would be following in the footsteps of S. D. Riddell, owner of Man o' War, who retired this prince of turf to the stud after three years of record-breaking racing. His retirement caused a sensation at the time, some turf enthusiasts urging that Man o' War be permitted to continue his racing career. Financially, however, the great horse is as valuable to Mr. Riddell as a breeder as he would have been had he continue to race, which, if Morvich stands out this year, would apply similarly to him. Mr. Block has insisted that Morvich "is the property of the public" and is waiting until her Derby is raced.

Home runs apparently are as plentiful this season as they were last year. Babe Ruth should find no trouble in getting his share of circuit smacks after May 20th.

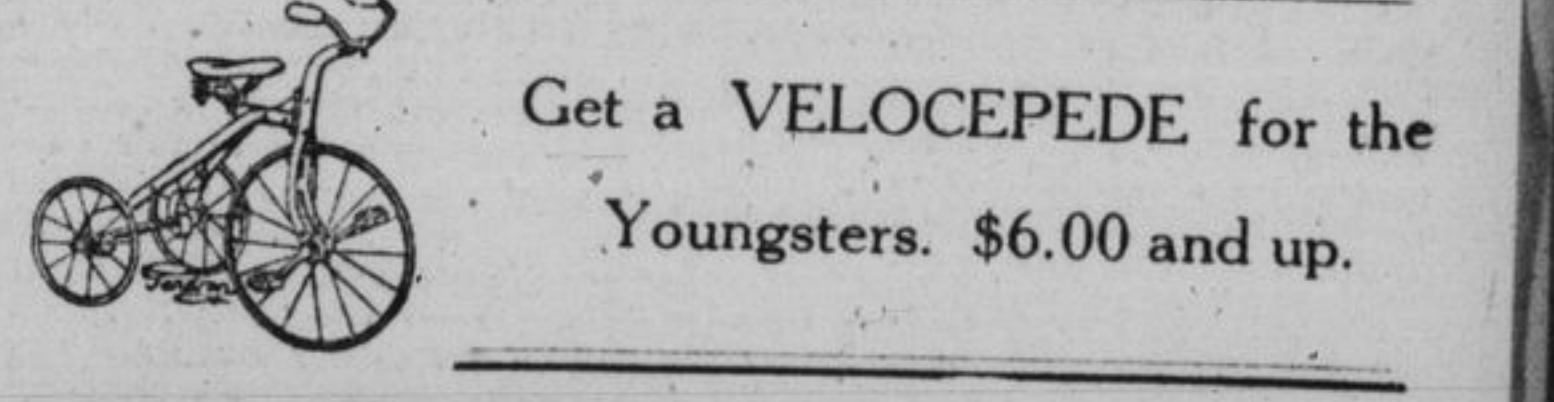

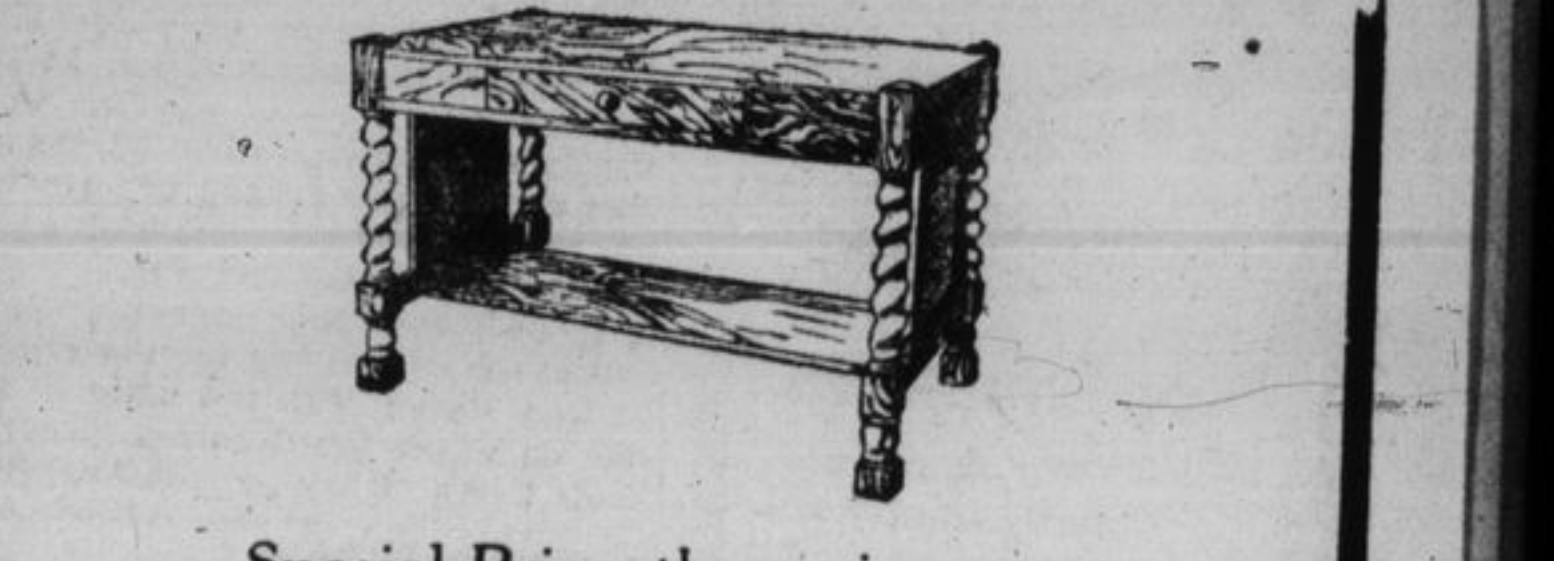
