AMERICAN COMMANDER HONORS CANADA'S DEAD



ON the occasion of his recent visit to Montreal to receive a degree from McGill University, General John J. Pershing, Commander-in-Chief of the United States Army, paid graceful tribute to Canada's soldiers who gave their lives in the Great War. At the end of the day, as he went to his private car in the Windsor Street C.P.R. Station, General Pershing took occasion to pay a visit to the bronze group erected to the memory of eleven hundred C.P.R. employees who died in the service of King and country.

At a Canadian Club luncheon during the afternoon, General Pershing had said:

STARTING REFORM OF FASHIONS IN PARIS

The Catholic Women's Congress Decides to Ban American Dances.

Paris, May 23.—The International Congress of Women's Catholic Leagues, presided over by Cardinal Merry del Val, has been busily discussing the vexed question of the influence on public morality of fashions, motion pictures, theatres and dancing. Recognizing the utter impossibility of condemning dancing altogether, the Congress has finally decided to ban American dances and recommend a return to classical and national forms.

With regard to theatres and motion pictures, falling the establishment of censorship it was suggested that the best means to fight immorality and doubtful production would be by organizing boycotts.

The fashions of the women's attire were lengthily discussed, the necessity of a reaction against the wearing of dresses which the congress considers indecent was urged. It was finally decided that as Paris is the world's fashion centre, it was essential to commence the campaign here. Therefore it was decided to form in Paris a committee of members drawn from the highest society. This committee will be instructed to closely watch the evolution of fashions, modifying them according to Catholic morals and esthetics, and transmit instructions to the various branches of the league throughout the world in order that concerted action may be taken whenever necessary.

Vancouver Clubs to Pay License Fee of \$500

Vancouver, May 23.—Effective June 3th, all Vancouver clubs will be called upon to pay an annual license fee of \$500 and the manager of each club will be licensed and must keep a stock book according to the provisions of a bylaw adopted by the city councilors today which will come up for final reading Thursday.

According to Attorney-General W. E. Raney there is little prospect of the Legislature concluding its work within the next three weeks.

FLAPPERISM NOT DISEASE BUT JUST A DIVERSION

Illinois Pastor Says Bobbed-Haired Girls Will Make Fine Women.

Chicago, May 23.—The modern flapper was defended by the Rev. A. Pennewell, pastor of the Covenant Church at Evanston, Ill., Sunday, in a sermon in which he approved short skirts, bobbed hair and knickerbockers.

"Flapperism is not a disease but a diversion," he said. "Bobbed hair, short skirts and knickerbockers are not signs of sin, but a declaration of independence. The girls are a jolly lot and they will give us the finest generation of women the world has ever known."

"We are passing from the mah age, a rough age, and emerging into the age of culture, the women's age. That is why the flapper exists to-day. The new age will be one not ruled by women but one in which their influence will be felt. Girls in the past have been pretty little birds in cages of husky beasts of burden."

All Omens Are Good For Alberta Crop

Calgary, May 23.—The Herald in its third 1922 crop report for Alberta, says:

Sowing of wheat in Alberta is practically completed in all parts of the Province. In many parts of the Province early grain is showing above ground and is in a remarkably healthy condition. Taking the Province as a whole, an increase in wheat acreage over last year is indicated. Moisture conditions are excellent. In the south the soil is still extremely wet.
