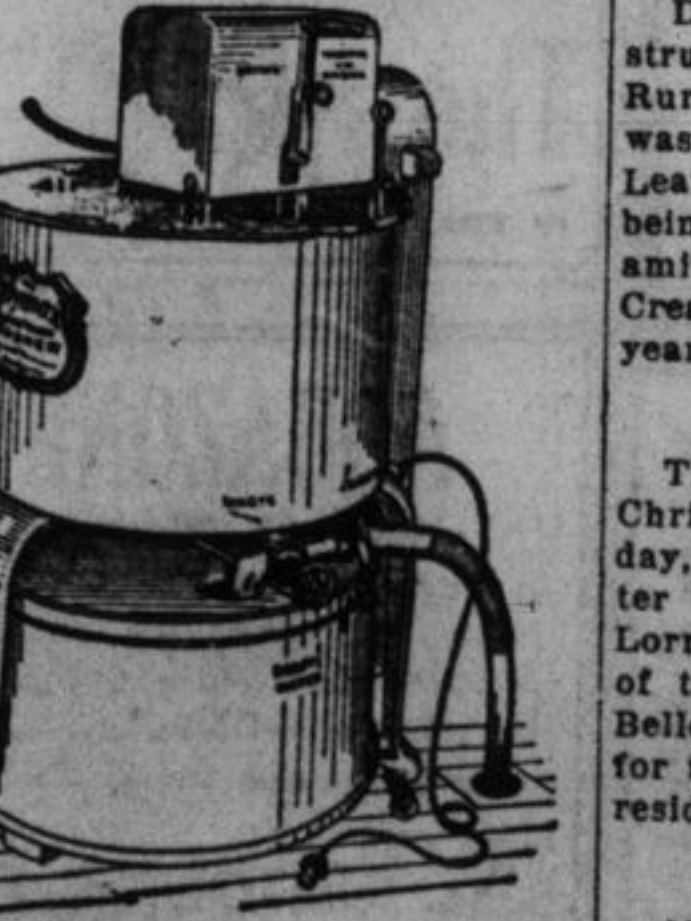

The only reason for Mr. MacKinnon's retirement is failing health.

Granted Incorporation.
A dominion charter has been granted to Northern Buttons, Limited, with a capital of \$300,000 and chief place of business at Smith's Falls. The incorporators are members of an Ottawa legal firm. This company has been formed to take over the business of the International Button Co. in Smith's Falls.

Broken Arm by Motor.
D. R. Leavens, Belleville, was struck by a motor driven by the Rural Dean Swayne. The motor was moving slowly at the time. Mr. Leavens suffered a broken arm, this being determined after an X-ray examination in the office of Dr. McCreary. Mr. Leavens is eighty-four years of age.

Alfred Whitnall, of the Methodist Book Room, Toronto, and Miss Elsie Stone, Gananoque, were quietly married Saturday evening at the home of the bride's sister, Mrs. Joseph Menden, Gananoque, by the Rev. D. Mick, pastor of Grace church. A wedding supper was served to a few immediate friends, af-

ter which the happy couple left by the night train for their home in Toronto.

Summer Travel Begun.
The season at the Thousand Islands has opened. It promises one of the best seasons on the St. Lawrence river. The bookings at the hotels show a marked increase over last season and the summer tourists seem to be travelling earlier. The island residents have been coming for the last ten days and nearly all of the summer colony has arrived at their summer homes.

Florence May Miller Dead.
A sad death occurred in the Cottage Hospital, Pembroke, on 26th May when Florence May, youngest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Miller, Pembroke, passed away in her eighteenth year. On May 10th Miss Miller had been operated on for appendicitis and had been recovering satisfactorily. She developed what appeared to be tonsillitis, but which after proved to be lock jaw, which caused her death.

Address at Unveiling Ceremony.
At Kemptville, on Saturday, a significant ceremony, the unveiling of a statue to the dead soldiers of Kemptville, Oxford and South Gower, took place. Right Hon. Arthur Meighan made an address after the ceremony. The statue is of grey granite and about thirteen feet in height, consisting of two flat sides, embodying the roll of honor, surmounted by the figure of a Canadian soldier. Close on three thousand people witnessed the unveiling.

Giles-Windover Wedding.
A quiet wedding took place at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Walter E. Windover, Frankford, on June 3rd, when their eldest daughter, Kate Marguerite, was married to William A. J. Giles, Phm. B., son of Mrs. A. A. Giles. The bride, given away by her father, looked charming in a wedding dress of silk crepe and wore the customary veil and orange blossoms. The wedding march was played by Miss Helen Windover, sister of the bride.

Appointed to 4th Hussars.
The current issue of the Canada Gazette contains notice of the ap-

pointment of Capt. A. C. Casselman to the 4th Hussars, and he will be second-in-command of the squadron at Prescott. Capt. Casselman served in France with an artillery unit, and is now practicing law in Prescott. He was a successful candidate for the constituency of Grenville, in the recent dominion elections, but upon receiving a government appointment, resigned his seat in favour of Ex-Premier Meighan.
