In the College Grounds-Baccalaureate Sermon Preached in St. George's.

The closing exercises of the Royal a. m. a tablet was unveiled the college grounds to the memory of all graduates who fell in action during the late war, Dean Starr officiating. The tablet is located between the eight birch trees that were planted in memory of eight cadets of the graduating class of 1910. The ceremony was attended by the entire staff of the college, the gentlemen cadets and many visitors.

The baccalaureate sermon was preached by Rev. Dr. Seager, Trinity College, Toronto, in St. George's Cathedral at 11 a.m. where a special service was held by Dean Starr.

The chancel was beautifully decorated with red and white flowers provided by the graduating class and special music was rendered by the choir, the hymns being selected by the cadets. It was a full choral service and Holy Communion was celebrated, over one hundred and fifty cadets partaking. The service was most impressive and spectacular as the cadets formed two long lines in the center aisle extending from the altar rail through the chancel and down to the nave. The scarlet tunics, crimson sashes and gold braid contrasted vividly with the combre hues of the edifice, and made the scene a brilliant one long to be remembered. In addition to this the cathedral was crowded by young ladies, garbed in the height of fashion, and whose presence was attracted by the greatest social event of the season, the June ball, that takes place this evening.

The Royal Military College staff donell, the commandant, was present in full dress uniform. The cadets marched from the college under command of Major E. de L. Greenwood, staff adjutant, and presented a very fine appearance, the white helmets and scarlet tunics of pre-war days giving the battalion a very distinctive and picturesque charm that the service khaki does not have.

Dean Starr in introducing Rev. Dr. Seager who was to preach the valedictory sermon, said that many of the cadets were attending the cathedral for the last time and there was a special message for them.
