

In cases where a single note or chord needs special accent this may be produced by a sudden thrust of the foot. For the same reason that good "footwork" on the pedals is what determines the best playing of a pipeorgan, so it is that thoughtful and constantly regulated pumping is what produces the best effect from a player-piano.

5. The pedal should be used sparingly and only when it is desirable to prolong the vibration of a certain note or group of notes or to bind chords together. Never keep the pedal on to produce a more powerful fortissimo; that only produces a plurred discord almost intolerable to sensitive ears.

6. If you study your player plane seriously, practicing faithfully, and following these simple directions, you will produce results that will delight all who listen to you.




