MAGNIFICENT CROP YEAR

Farmers Prepare For a Great Harvest—Hay Crops Are Enormous.

Enquiries made in the different districts of the surrounding country indicate that this year will be a record one for the crops, both in quantity and quality, and the farmers are making preparations for one of their biggest years unless something unforeseen develops. During the past week a farmer who has lived in this district for eighty-nine years stated that he can not remember when the growth was better than this year.

During the past week and continuing up to the present time practically every farmer has been busy getting the hay into the barns. Some of the farms are reported as producing five times as much hay this year as last. But last season was a very light growth and many farmers were forced to buy hay to winter their herds. One farmer stated to the Whig that he had to pay out \$500 for such last winter. It is not thought that the rain of Tuesday evening will do so very much damage to the hay.

Other crops are expected to be as good in proportion as the hay. The potato crop would do better with a little more rain, but during the haying the farmers are satisfied with the dry weather. The potato crop is also expected to be good and many farmers are digging early potatoes. The bugs are as usual on the job but not more than other years. The corn has made great progress during the past week and has grown almost noticeably from day to day. The grain is also coming on rapidly and in some sections will be ready to cut before the more tardy ones have the hay all in.

Travellers through the district noticed a few farmers getting the buckwheat started this week. The honey buyers are now on their rounds through the country trying to close deals for the production, which is also expected to be plentiful. Raspberries are now getting more abundant and are stated to be ripening very quickly.
