THE LOOP OR COIL AERIAL.

A loop aerial is one which is made by winding one or more turns of wire on an insulating framework in the form of a solenoid or spiral coil. The latter is sometimes referred to as a "pancake" coil. In general, the loop aerial will not pick up as much energy from passing radio waves as an antenna unless it is of nearly the same dimensions as the antenna. In some cases, however, a loop is found to be as effective as a regular antenna of larger dimensions than the coil.

When the plane of the loop is oriented so as to be parallel with the direction of propagation of the radio waves from a sending station a difference of potential is set up between the wires on opposite sides of the coil. This occurs because a certain brief fraction of a second elapses between the cutting of the wires nearest the sender and those further away. If the plane of the loop were at light angles to the direction of the advancing radio waves both sides of the coil would be cut by these waves at the same time, an : there would be no difference of potential theoretically. If the coil is shunted by a variable condenser an oscillatory circuit is provided, which can be tuned to the signal wave frequency or wave length. The loop is then really only the antenna tuning enlarged to greater dimensions. Due to the fact, however, that the position of the coil aerial with respect to the front of the radio waves determines the relative amount of energy picked up (voltage and current induced in

the coil) it has directive proper ties. In receiving, therefore, the signals are of maximum strength, other things being equal, when the loop is properly oriented with regard to the sending station, and a lesser percentage of energy is picked up from other stations not in line with the plane of the loop. There is an obvious possibility of interference elimination, as well as a possibility of locating the direction of a sending station. The advancing waves from a

sending station are frequently distorted in their direction of propagation by conducting objects. If the loop aerial is operated in too close proximity to such an object the plane of the loop will not point directly to the station because of this distortion. The distortion is greatest when the loop is very close to the object and decreases with an increase in the distance separating the two. Such distortion effects are quite noticeable when operating a loop aerial beneath an iron or steel bridge er beneath a wire, as, for example a trolley wire. Operation within steel buildings also will frequently givo great distortion. Large trees, fences, masts and towers will also give distortion if the loop aerial is too close by.

Loop aerials are most advantageous at the shorter wave lengths, and very good results have been had with their use when receiving from broadcasting stations at not too great distances. As a general rule, however, they do pick up as much energy as regular antenna, and frequently a radio frequency amplifier must be used.
