Find Body of a Man in Lake Near Lumber Camp. About ten days ago he obtained a job at Redwater camp under the name of J. Gilbert, but he disappeared on Sunday last.

Fire Sweeps Maple Leaf Milling Plant at Welland. Welland, July 21.—Fire caused a heavy loss to the Maple Leaf Milling Company's plant here shortly before noon to-day. The blaze was discovered shortly after eleven o'clock and had spread through the mill before water could be applied. The fire was still burning at 12:15 o'clock.

AN ENGLISHMAN WILL GET APPOINTMENT. As Chaplain of the Portsmouth Penitentiary—Salvation Army is Excluded. There are already several applications filed for the position of Protestant chaplain at the Portsmouth penitentiary, made vacant by the resignation of Archdeacon Dobbs. The different denominations are said to claim the right to nominate the candidate, but it is stated that an Anglican will be appointed at Portsmouth because the other denominations are already represented at the other federal penitentiaries, a Methodist minister having been withdrawn in the past few months appointed at the maritime penitentiary. The Salvation Army is excluded because of a technicality in the Penitentiaries act which stipulates "an ordained" minister whereas the Salvation Army has no ordained ministers, its officers being commissioned. The strict interpretation of the act has prevented the appointment of Salvationists as chaplains.
