

Among the post-war outbursts of new cuits and revivals of old ones, from spiritualism to auto-suggestion, it was fairly certain that black magic would again become conspicuous. As the oldert of all religions and one which still survives more or less unchanged over half the world, devil worship, which is another name for it, is always certain of a hearing whenever the human mind gets shaken out of its accustomed rut, writes a Paris' correspondent of the New York Post. The cave dweller, when first he heard a thunderstorm, was probably the first devil worshipper; the latest, though by no means the last, have their headquarters almost within hearing of the Madeleine-in an extremely respectable street just off the Grandes Boulewards, that is to say. The Black Mass, familiar to all students of demonology, has never altogether lacked its votaries in Paris. They were very much in evidence in the days when the French monarchy was dying. 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
