STRONG CHARACTERISTICS OF HONORABLE MAN

The Qualities Necessary in Attaining the Highest Success.

A very inspiring sermon was given in St. Andrew's church, on Sunday morning, by Rev. Dr. W. W. Gilles, East Orange, New Jersey, his subject being "What Is Your Life?" The strong characteristics of a successful and honorable man were fully set forth by the speaker, and the address showed the frailties of human nature equally as well as the stronger and more desirable side. Success in life could only be attained, remarked the speaker, through a true co-ordination of intelligence, affection and will. The man who had these three qualities in equal proportion, was the man who reached the highest pinnacle of success, and who was honored and beloved by his fellow countrymen. The man who fell short in one or more, failed to rise above the common herd. A man might have more than ordinary brain-power, with several degrees conferred on him by universities, yet if he proved weak in affection and will, he could never amount to anything in the world. The man who was strong on affection, but deficient in mind and will, became a sentimentalist, a "sob-sister," or a sensualist, and of no value to the nation. And lastly, he who had nothing of intelligence or affection, but more than his share of will, could be nothing but a bully, probably the most deplorably type of all. Striking examples of those who had engraven their names in the Hall of Fame, through their honest endeavors, coupled with these three noble qualities, were given by Dr. Gilles, and the list included Lincoln, Gladstone, and others famous in the history of our own and foreign lands. But there are other men, some dead and some living, who, though not so well-known, have nevertheless helped to build their country upon the rock of sound character and good citizenship, and the young men of today would do well to pattern his own life on the "grand old men" who live around him.

At Sydenham Street Church.

In Sydenham street church on Sunday, Rev. E. Le Roy Rice, for some years a pastor of First Congregational church, held services for the combined congregations of Chalmers and Sydenham street churches. In the morning he preached on the subject of "Will the Church Survive?" in which he stated that the church to survive must be an emancipated, regenerated, prophetic and a truly Christian church with a Christian rather than a denominational consciousness. Rev. Mr. Rice will conduct the services next Sunday.
