ENJOYED RAPIDS INCIDENT

D. J. Millan and Daughters Last to Leave the Stranded Vessel.

D. J. Millan, and his two daughters, Earl Street, returned to Kingston on Sunday afternoon from a trip up the Saguenay river. They were passengers on the steamer Rapids Prince at the time of the accident to that vessel in the Lachine Rapids, and they were the last people to leave in the small boats.

A graphic account of the exciting hours spent on the stranded vessel was given to a Whig reporter by Mr. Millan. He stated that there was very little panic after the steamer struck the ledge and became fast, but that during the night many of the passengers were frightened. It was very fortunate that the vessel had not struck a little lower down, as he ledge broke off into deep water a few feet from the boat and she might easily have upset at this point.

The splendid work of the mayor of Verdun and his assistants who handled all the passengers of the steamer, and worked untiringly with their small craft, was lauded by Mr. Millan. Here was where the dangerous feature of the rescue entered, as after leaving the steamer, the small boat was forced to run the gauntlet of about fifty yards of swirling rapids, before making the landing at Heron Island. From this point the passengers were taken to Montreal in motor boats.

The remainder of the trip down the St. Lawrence and up the beautiful Saguenay was uneventful. The weather was ideal in every way, and

on the water, delightfully cool, while the splendid accommodations and comfort provided on the steamers long to be remembered. But when the scribe asked Mr. Millan if the unfortunate accident to the Rapids Prince had spoiled the trip, the "wind was knocked out of his sails" to hear that this thrilling episode was the best event of all. Which goes to show that a certain general grocer, located on lower Princess street, had not forgotten the time when he was one of those who went down to the sea in ships.

OBITUARY

The Late George Wheeler.

On Monday morning the death occurred at Inverary of George Wheeler, at the ripe old age of eighty-one years. The deceased had been ailing for some time. He had been a well-known farmer in the district. The funeral, in charge of James Reid, was held on Monday afternoon, the service being conducted by the Rev. Mr. Calbert, and the remains were transferred to Fulton, N. Y., for interment.

Mrs. Neville Wins Case. At Clayton, N.Y., the hearing in the case of Mrs. Sadie Neville against William Marrin, was heard on Friday. Mrs. Neville, who has been a clerk for Marrin for twelve years, charged that in 1921 Marrin promised to pay her for all overtime that she worked after her 9 hours a day and that he also promised a commission of one-half of one per cent. on all of her sales. Last April she demanded that she be paid this and Marrin refused to pay her. She brought the suit. Mrs. Neville won, being awarded \$153, of which amount \$23 were for overtime and \$130 were for commissions on sales.
