A GYPSY IS ARRESTED; WANTED AT BRAMPTON

Long Demetro is Accused—Will Face Shopbreaking Charge There.

Long Demetro a member of a gypsy band encamped over at Barriefield, was placed under arrest on Sunday morning, by Provincial Constable Thomas Mullings of the Kingston police force. He is wanted in Brampton, on a charge of shopbreaking, and is being held at the police station here, awaiting the arrival of an officer from Brampton.

The accused had a motor car, and this is also being held at the police station until the case is disposed of. Word was received on Sunday about Demetro being wanted in Brampton and Constable Clark immediately got busy and it was not long before the accused was rounded up.

It is stated that several other members of a gypsy band are also wanted in Brampton, but that they made their way east in motor cars.

Gypsy Got Away With \$50 But Money Was Recovered

The police are looking for a male member of a gypsy band, who put one over his fellow gypsies and made off with \$50. He is in parts unknown.

It all happened in this way. One of the members of the band who have been camping at Barriefield, was corralled by the local police on Sunday, for the police at Brampton, where he is wanted on a charge of theft. Long Demetro is the name of the gypsy locked up. Another male member of the band took this opportunity of making some easy money. He went to the wife of the prisoner, and stated that her husband wanted her to give him \$50, stating that if he secured the money he could get her hubby out of the police station. She handed over the amount asked for, and was very much surprised to find later on that the man had taken the money and that her husband was still in the "lockup."

The police were notified about the matter, and every effort is being made to locate the gypsy who got the money. The wife of the gypsy under arrest was at the police station on Monday morning, and attracted much attention around the city in her gypsy garb of very bright colors. She wore a necklace of gold pieces. Members of the band have lots of money.
