Kingston's population was visibly, if temporarily, increased on Thursday with the arrival of over four hundred excursionists from Watertown, N. Y., and during the afternoon many of the principal points of interest in the city were visited by the strangers.

Sold on the Curb.
It is stated that although there was no cheese sold on the Frontenac Board at its meeting on Thursday the sales took place on the street. The price offered on the board was 12 1/2 cents, and it is hinted that the price on the street was a little higher. It is of interest to note that during the war cheese in this district brought as high as 33 cents.

School Destroyed.
The school house located at Washburn's Corners, near Athens, was discovered to be on fire on Friday evening last and was destroyed. From what can be learned the fire started inside the building, which has been closed since the holidays began. It was a fine stone school equipped up to standard and its loss will be a blow to the section.

Affix Sufficient Stamps.
The tax on cheques went into effect on August 1st last, but many cheques are yet being received minus sufficient stamps. On cheques not exceeding \$5,000 the tax is 2c for each \$50 or fraction thereof. It is an offence not to affix the correct number of stamps. Local business firms are now being forced to return cheques not properly stamped, as the tax is too high to expect them to bear it.

Mrs. Marshall Dillabough Dead.
The death occurred on Wednesday at Brockville, of Dossie May Hutt, wife of Mr. Marshall Dillabough, who had been in ill-health for about a year. The late Mrs. Dillabough, who was born at Morrisburg, on Nov. 5th, 1894, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Elmer Hutt, now of Brockville, had resided in Brockville for the past eight years. Nine years ago

she married Mr. Dillabough, who survives with three sons.

Veterans Will Attend.
Plans have been completed for the central and northern New York convention of the British Great War Veterans of America, to be held in Watertown, N. Y., the last week in August, by the Watertown branch of the Camp Vimy Ridge of the veterans. Definite date for the convention has not yet been announced. It is expected that a number of veterans from this city will attend.

An Attractive Rural Drive.
The road from the city to Collin's Bay is in fine shape since the new bridge has been built near the village of Collin's Bay and is now a very attractive rural drive. In some places the road has become very narrow due to the sweet clover growing and crowding the roadway. The growth has made the road dangerous for cars passing, as the motorist cannot judge how much room he has to spare on the side of the road. A half day's work with a scythe now will probably prevent collisions between cars passing on this section.

To Tear Up Dangerous Walks.
There is approximately 7,500 feet of board walk still remaining in the limits of Napanee some of which is in a dangerous state of repair. The cost of putting down new cement walks to replace the above 7,500 feet

would be about \$6,000, which could be taken care of by twenty-year debentures at a yearly cost of \$300 by the town and \$200 by the adjacent property. The council agreed that all board walks in a dangerous condition be torn up.

Some Good Fishing.
Robert Bonner, Napanee, and his nephew, Robert Young, Jr., Syracuse, went fishing and caught twenty-seven bullheads and one pickerel weighing eight pounds. They also caught an all three feet long.
While sailing off Glen Island on M. B. Mills' yacht, Dolphin, J. W. Robinson had the good luck to catch a forty-two and a half pound maskinonge. The fish measured fifty-three inches in length. M. B. Mills is mounting the fish.

Elected a New President.
A meeting of the directors of the Hotel Renfrew was held to elect a member to fill the position of president. This position was held for many years by W. E. Smallfield. On his removal to Toronto J. McN. Austin was elected and his untimely death left again a vacancy. At the meeting Friday, J. L. Murray was elected president and J. A. Jamieson, vice-president. Messrs. J. K. Rochester and A. L. Handford were appointed to the directorate, the former to fill the vacancy left by the death of A. A. Wright, and the latter in Mr. Austin's place.
