DE VALERA MAY ATTACK DUBLIN

He Is Said To Be Rallying An Army in County Louth.

Dublin, Aug. 25.—Eamon de Valera today dramatically emerged from his hiding place and is rallying an army in county Louth in preparation for an attack on Dublin, according to persistent reports here. The rumor ran rapidly through crowds mourning at the bier of Michael Collins, whose body lies in state in the city hall. Officers of the Free State government were understood to be attempting to communicate with towns in county Louth in an effort to ascertain the truth or falsity of the reports. County Louth lies just north of Dublin. If de Valera has reappeared, he has seized this opportunity when he believes the Free State demoralized by Collins' assassination, to make another effort to overthrow the government and establish a republic.
