An attempt to rescue the fast disappearing servant girl from oblivion is being made in England by the catablishment of a college for the training of young girls in domestic science and the useful arts, \$250,-000 having been set aside by the government for this purpose. The cost of training a girl to take a position in domestic service is \$100.
