A Few Helpful Hints for Youthful Exhibitors.

Bear the Ancestors In Mind-Pick Typy Animals-How to Feed and Handle Colts, Calves and Lambs -Boys Are Making Good as Exhibitors.

(Contributed by Ontario Department of Agriculture, Toronto.)

Calves that have been fed liberally and judiciously will develop as the factors which we call heredity de termine. .It will be all calf, but its perfection of form is determined by its parentage. Feed cannot make a square beef calf out of a threecornered dairy calf. So to begin with the feeder should select the young calf largely on the individuality of the parents. Get a calf that will feed out to be as good or better than its ancestors-something that is worth while spending time and money onand then take care of it. The lamb's fleece at least two weeks pervious to the show. Lambs that are kept up and fed in covered pens will show a bettrimmed one week or more after washing, if washing is practiced, and care taken to keep the fleece free of chaff and dust until the exhibition variety in feeding stuffs should be sought in order to keep up the lamb's appetite, using oats, corn wheat, bran, cracked peas, barley meal and oil cake meal for the grain portion as roughage. These feeds if mixed to give a ration, with a nutritive care of the growth demands and fatten the lambs. Should it be desired pasture, the grain ration given can be used. The lambs should be han-dled sufficiently to make them tame enough to stand well when being exsibited. If more than one lamb is called for in a class, all individuals should be uniform in size, type, condition of fleece and body fleshing. Getting the Plg Ready.

Pigs presented for exhibition at school or other fairs should first of all be of the proper type and weight for the class in which it is planned to exhibit them. The exhibit should be clean. This condition is best eccomplished by an application of varm water, soap and the scrubbin brush. The crate or pen should b well bedded with straw or shaving tive. It should also be free from nails, old wire, broken bottles or any other material likely to injure the exhibit.—L. Stevenson, Sec., Dept. of a medical practice.


