The party spent the night on the island, and next morning, the wind having abated, they paddled the boat up to Tremont Park, where they secured assistance and were towed over to town. Their friends were deeply concerned about their welfare, and though less than two miles from home were off the route generally travelled by those out in motor boats, consequently their signals for help were not seen.
