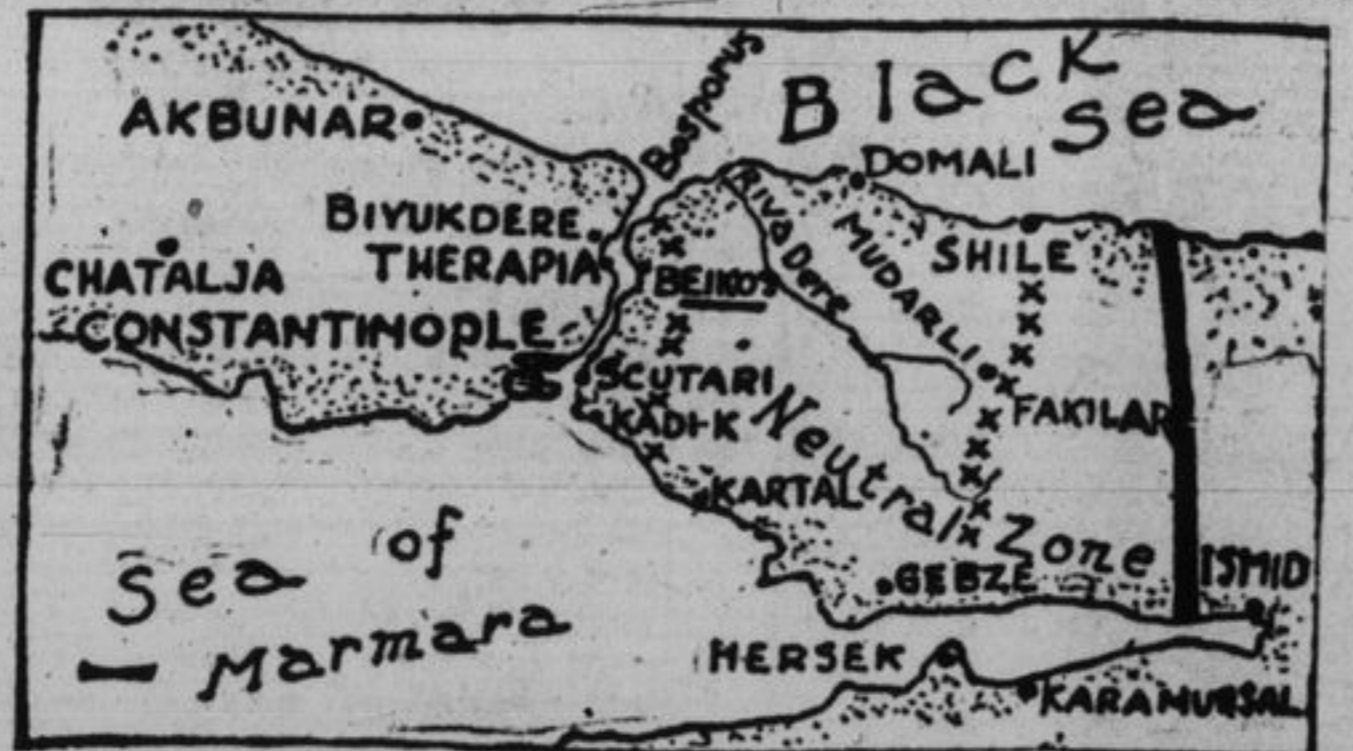

NEW INVASION OF THE NEUTRAL ZONE AT ISMID.



Large Turkish forces appear to have broken into the neutral zone west of Ismid, which the British are trying to defend. The British probably have not been able to stretch a continuous line from the gulf of Ismid to the Black Sea along the front, indicated by the heavy black line on the map, but they partially entrenched that front and two other lines well to the rear.

AEROPLANES TO CARRY ARMIES IN THE FUTURE

This is the Opinion of Lt.-Col. Barker, Who Addressed the R.M.C. Cadets.

That armies will be transported to the theatre of war by aeroplanes travelling at a hundred miles an hour is the conviction of Lieut.-Colonel W. G. Barker, V.C., D.S.O., M.C., D.F.C., and Italian Cross of Honor, the Canadian ace who yesterday addressed the gentlemen cadets of the Royal Military College on the subject "Aircraft in War."

Colonel Barker was introduced to the cadets by the commandant who referred to him as the westerner who had single-handedly attacked sixty enemy machines, and though suffering from wounds in both legs and a shattered elbow, succeeded in reaching the British lines after wrecking several of the German aeroplanes.

The British government is proceeding with arrangements under which it will be paying \$50,000,000 to the United States on Monday next as the yearly interest on its war loan.

Canada tops the list of countries in trade with the United States during August. The United States sold more goods to Canada than any other country, and also bought more goods from the Dominion during the month.

Canadian National Express Company will carry relief supplies to northern Ontario free of charge. It is understood that the Dominion Express Company will take similar action.

Campbellton, N.B., reports that between seventy-five and eighty million feet is the conservative estimate of the lumber cut expected this winter on the Restigouche river and tributaries three times as great as last season.
