**REDUCTION IN PRICES.**

Wholesale Figures Show Drop of 1-3 P.C. from August.  
Washington, Oct. 20.—The average level of wholesale prices in September, the Department of Labor reported yesterday, was about 1-3 per cent. lower than in August. The index number representing comparative price levels of 404 different commodities, dropped from 155, as determined in August, to 153 in September.

Fuel and light materials were chiefly responsible for the reduction having dropped ten per cent. during the month. Farm products, building materials, textiles and clothing all showed small declines.
