Some \$25,000 Raised.

Pembroke Cottage Hospital.
 At the annual meeting of the Pembroke Cottage Hospital Association the treasurer's report showed receipts, made up of grants, fees and subscriptions from various sources, amounting to \$18,742.04, and expenditures of \$15,659.54 leaving a balance on hand of \$3,082.50. The superintendent's report showed that 488 patients had been treated during the year ending September 30th. There were 31 births in the hospital and 11 deaths; 461 patients were discharged and there were 16 patients in the hospital at the end of September. The report of J. R. Lockhart, treasurer of the extension fund, showed that \$88,015.61 has been subscribed to the fund for the new hospital and \$59,471.78 of this has been paid. At the organization meeting J. H. Reeves was re-elected president.

Gifts For Queen's Museum.
 Principal Dyde preached anniversary sermons in Knox church, Black's Corner, on Sunday. An interesting ceremony at the close of the day's services was the presentation to Principal Dyde by Rev. Mr. Lowry on behalf of the congregations of Knox and St. Paul's churches, of a box containing valuable relics of past usage, to be preserved in the museum of Queen's Theological College. Dr. Dyde, in receiving these souvenirs of the historic past, expressed the gratitude of the college authorities for them and assured the good people of Beckwith and Franktown, that they would be treasured with peculiar care in the rooms at Kingston. He hoped that Mr. Lowry would continue his antiquarian researches, and would prepare for publication his historical narratives of his present congregations for future usefulness.

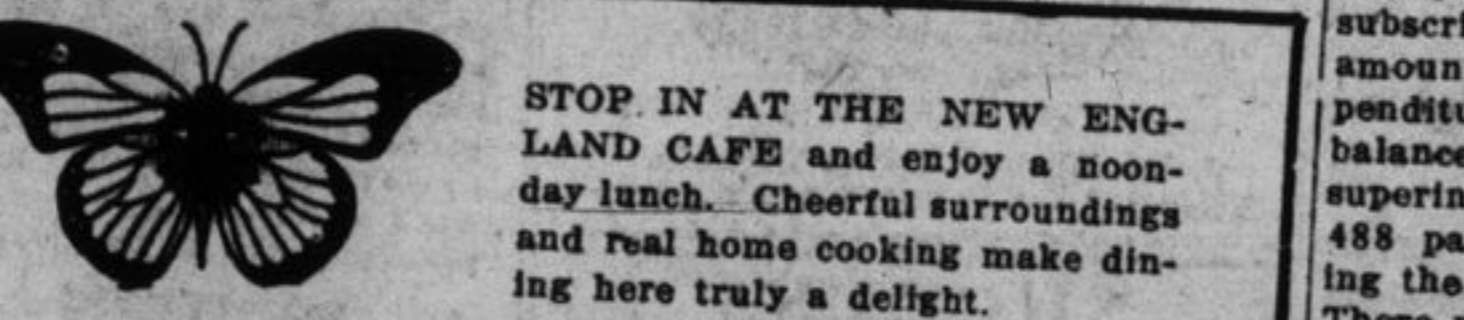
