FROM A LABORER TO COLLEGE STAR

System Prevailed in United States of Paying Way of Huskies Through College.

Peterboro Examiner The explanation given by Rev. Bruce Taylor, principal of Queen's University, regarding the policy of the college with respect to athletics will serve to dispel very greatly rumors which have been in circulation regarding the manner in which Queen's has secured a good football team this year. Dr. Taylor makes it plain that money has not been used to entice promising players to the college.

For many years, college athletics in the United States rested under the shadow of a vicious system by means of which wealthy graduates, working together, brought up good athletes and paid them to attend some particular university. Indeed, even today many prominent athletes in Canada can tell of offers they have received from several American colleges where they were invited to come and secure free education with expenses paid so long as they would turn out and play football, hockey or some other game. Countless American professional men received their education in this way.

Amazing Revelation. The extent to which the American practice went was shown a few years ago by articles contributed to a well-known American magazine. The revelations were amazing. A husky

boy would be working in a drain somewhere when a well-dressed man would approach him and suggest his need of an education. The "find" would be subjected to a physical examination and if he met the test, he would be packed off to college, all decked out in the latest style and with money in his pocket. Some of the greatest football heroes of the times were discovered in this way, including, it is understood, Jim Hogan, of Yale; Heston, of Michigan; Vanderboom, of the same college and a host of others. Heston, a physical marvel, was able to do the hundred yards in ten seconds while dressed in football togs.

A Student Oratory.

Vanderboom, of Michigan, was one of the stars developed by the famous coach, Yost. His feats on the football field have colored the story of American athletics. He was a huge man, powerfully built, with tremendous strength and enduring power. And at college, it was revealed Vanderboom was taking up only one subject. What was it? Who could guess? Oratory.

The professional coach system at American colleges helped to encourage the practice of selecting new students according to their athletic qualifications. No matter how good a coach may be, he cannot win without the winning material. He cannot reap where he has not sown, and it is the most natural thing in the world for a coach to take steps to sow, a few good seeds where they will do the most good. To the help of the American college coaches came wealthy organizations of college graduates, all anxious to see their old universities win out over their rivals. College football became a contest in spending money.

Sport in Colleges.

Against any such system as this the Canadian colleges are to be warned by all who love clean sport in which the best man wins. The little flurry regarding Queen's University shows a healthy state of public opinion. At the same time, the system of purchasing athletes can be credited with having sent a good many men through college that would otherwise have never attained professional standing in the battle of life. Participation in sport is a legitimate part of a college education, as the late Cecil Rhodes believed when he made athletic progress one of the qualifications for those seeking Rhodes scholarships at Oxford, but the British universities follow the excellent policy of forcing all physically fit students to play games, a policy often contrasted with the American and Canadian systems of limited participation and keen rivalry. Incidentally the lure of Rhodes scholarships has done much both in Canada and the United States in urging college students of the "bookworm" type to engage in sport so that they may qualify under the Rhodes plan.

AGED ARGENTINE RECLUSE Set Fire to Herself

Bahia Blanca, Argentine, Nov. 3.—Juanan Surata, an aged recluse, committed suicide yesterday by burning herself to death on a funeral pyre, which she had constructed herself.

According to the police, the aged woman had piled a quantity of wood shavings in the centre of the stone floor of her kitchen, poured oil over the wood, and, after saturating her own clothes, reclined upon the pile and touched a match to it.
