**ROBERTS NOT BROUGHT BEFORE LEGISLATURE**  
Still in Custody at Quebec—Premier to Speak on Thursday.  
Quebec, Nov. 8.—The provincial cabinet has taken up the case of John H. Roberts, now a prisoner of the sergeant-at-arms and decided not to deal with him yesterday afternoon. Delay in handling the case is said to be based on the fact that documents seized in the Axe office are being scrutinized by detectives. The premier's announcement has been received with surprise and disappointment as hundreds of curious people had arranged even by paying the page boys to get good places in the assembly chambers.  
Interest is keeping up and the whole province watching the next move of the authorities.  
It is understood that even if the House deems it advisable to pass a sentence on Roberts he may not be brought back to the bar of the House but dealt with on his precedent declarations. A debate is likely to result and there appears to be an understanding that should there be any

**The Sultan of Turkey On British Warship?**  
Paris, Nov. 8.—The sultan, the Petit Parisien hears, has fled from Constantinople and has taken refuge aboard a British warship.  
The Near Eastern crisis was made still more acute when the Kemalists, who seized civil authority, began applying their administrative measures in Constantinople, raising customs rates prohibitively and virtually abolished captulations.

A special British cabinet meeting was called Wednesday afternoon to consider the Near Eastern crisis.  
Foreign Secretary Curzon in an address in London on Wednesday declared that the position in the Near East at this moment constitutes a most definite menace to the peace of the world.  
At Ottawa the results of the U.S. elections are interpreted as an indication that the recent high tariff legislation at Washington has not been favorably received by the people.  
William Barnett, C.P.R. freight conductor, aged about forty years, Havelock, Ont., was instantly killed in the railway yards at Smith's Falls Wednesday morning, when the van of his train overturned, following a collision with another freight.
