
USE OF D. C. AND A. C. MOTORS

It has already been pointed out that an electric motor is almost identical with a generator in structure, but its function is reversed: it converts electrical power into mechanical power. It is important to have the motor suited to the kind of circuit on which it is to be used: a.c. or d.c., the right voltage, &c. Common voltages are 110 to 120; 220 to 240: 500 to 550; also for a.c. 440. Lower voltages may be used on battery circuits. A.c. motors, like generators, may be single phase. two phase, three phase, &c.; however, in radio single phase is the rule, especially with small units. D.c. motors may have series,

shunt, or compound excitation.
D.C. SHUNT MOTOR—If a shunt generator is used for charging a storage battery and the engine is cut off, the generator will continue to run provided the battery is large enough, but an ammeter in the circuit shows that the current has reversed. The battery is discharging and the generator is running as a motor. The actior is explained by the fact that when a current is sent through a conductor in a magnetic field there is a force that tends to push the conductor across the field. The left hand rule, already explained, gives the directions.

Consider the simple loop in Fig. 1, between the poles NS of an electro-magnet. If the wires + and - are connected to a source of direct current the iron will be magnetized. At the same time current flowing in the direction of the arrows in the loop causes a force toward the front in the conductor near the N pole and . force toward the tack in the conductor near the S pole. The loop turns. The effect of the commutator is to make the rotation continuous by making the proper connection to the conductors as they come into place.


