SHOULD REMOVE FALSE SIGNS FROM BUILDING

J. G. Evans' Building No Longer Headquarters of What Its Signs Tell.

The following facts have been brought to the attention of the Whig respecting the Kingston branch of the planation is asked:

Navy League. On a window to the left of the main entrance are the words: "Army and Navy," "Navy League Branch No. 122, "The Naval Brigade." On ten windows of the third floor are the words: "Naval Brigade," and one one window: "Navy League Office," "Branch No. 122." Across the whole front of the building above the cornice are the words: "Army and Navy Veterans."


A Pioneer of Ye Caintown District Passes Away. Caintown, Nov. 17 .- On Tuesday evening, Nov. 7th, there passed to rest


