"MARJOLAINE" AT GRAND WEDNESDAY EVENING

A Splendid Musical Production Based Upon an Old-time Drama.

The Grand had a charming attraction last night in "Marjolaine," a musical version of Louis N. Parker's "Pomander Walk," a drama written many years ago. It is a handsome production, and delighted a good-sized audience. The story unfolds a dainty romance, while it is amusing throughout the tuneful music adding much to the enjoyment of the production.

No doubt the scene of the play is familiar to many. "Marjolaine" is based on fine groups of diversified families, the residents of "Pomander Walk," an old row of houses "out Chiswick way," in London, over a hundred years ago. The costumes of both the male and female principals are a feature of the show, and are befitting the period of the story. The company is an excellent one. In the role of the winsome "Marjolaine," Miss Virginia O'Brien was exceptionally good, while her singing of "Nesting Place," made a big hit. Lennox Pawle, the English comedian, in the role of Jerome Brooke-Hoskyn Esq., calls for special mention. Frank Moulain, the chesty admiral, gave a true portrayal of the part. Other deserving high praise are Marian Mears, as Barbara; Royal Cotter, as Rev. Sternroed; Winford Young, as Jack Sayle; Arthur Geary, as Baron Otford; while a word of praise is also due to the girls in the ensemble who showed talent.

The stage settings are good, that showing the row of fine quaint little houses along the "Walk," being most impressive. The musical numbers were warmly applauded; the audience calling for encores. "Marjolaine" and "Cuddle Up" were very popular selections.

IN MARINE CIRCLES

The tug Manly and the dredge St. Lawrence arrived at Collin's Bay from Cobourg on Wednesday afternoon, where the latter vessel will do laid up for the winter. The Manly left for Toronto.

The steamer Brockville arrived from Picton and Belleville on Thursday morning with canned goods and other freight.

The steamer City of Ottawa arrived from Montreal on Thursday morning and cleared for Toronto and Hamilton with package freight.

The work of salvaging the steamer Moulton is still going on but no report of the progress attained has been received in the city since the Donnelly equipment went to the aid of the vessel early Wednesday morning.

The local marine season will practically be over in about two more weeks, and one of the longest seasons on record will then be brought to a close. Freight has been fairly heavy all summer and fall, and with the good weather during October and November, extra freight has been carried on the lake-routes with hardly a mishap.
