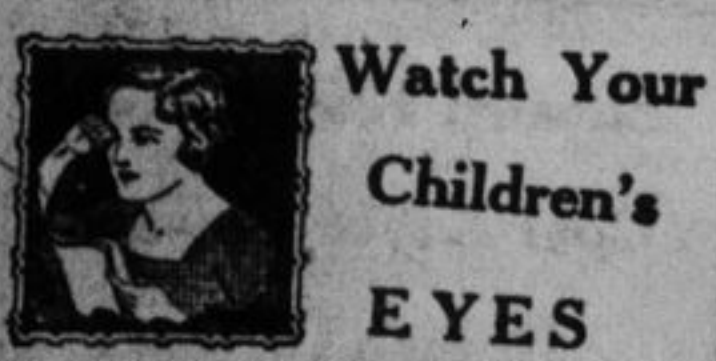

for so long a time that they never realize the conditions under which they are existing. Sometimes the slum has grown up about them so gradually that they do not realize the depths which these neighbors of theirs have reached. It must also be remembered that they know their neighbors, sometimes most intimately, and being conscious of their many good characteristics—they easily overlook their failings.

Many of them were cursed into the world. They were never wanted, anyway. That they survived at all is an inscrutable mystery, considering that so many others, better born and gladly welcomed, and with comfortable, happy homes, were early taken away. Chased by the policemen, swam when engaging in most harmless occupations—although a stupid, misapprehended ordinance may be held directly responsible; anted by the habitues of low-down resorts; lured by lying statements of what constitutes a "good time;" driven by an inborn passion which seemed well-nigh unconquerable—what chance was there to make good under such circumstances?

The houses in which they lived where maintained by an agent at a minimum of expense, hence they were often insanitary and always in bad repair. The food, especially the meat, the milk, the fruit and the vegetables, was almost invariably served before it came into the house, due to somebody's carelessness or neglect.

Actually, the worst slums, even in the big cities, are old-fashioned two and three story houses, formerly occupied by single families. Now one may find a family in every room—often fifty people in a house which was originally built to accommodate five. Some of the worst slums in this country are to be found in small towns—frequently in a small group of shanties alongside the railroad track.

Admitted that bad characters are fundamentally responsible for bad conditions, it must nevertheless be recognized that slums usually have their origin in bad housing conditions. The house in which one lives always has a decided influence upon one's methods of living, and usually upon one's morals. Therefore, it is reasonable to expect to find morals as degraded in some small towns or communities as one finds in the city. There are undoubtedly other causes of degradation in the small town—some of which are peculiar to it—but bad housing conditions and overcrowding are two determining factors in creating slum people. Hence—let's get after those who profit by such conditions.

Quebec to Check Hoarders.

Quebec, Nov. 25.—A drastic measure creating a fuel and food control board in this province, with powers to render obligatory and final decisions fixing and limiting the quantities of coal or food which may be sold in times of crisis to customers, and compelling manufacturers and merchants to supply the board with an inventory of the fuel and food they have in store in warehouses, was presented in the legislative assembly yesterday afternoon. Severe penalties are provided, and fines varying from \$25 to \$100 may be imposed under the Quebec Summary Conviction Act.
