THEATREGOERS HOPE REX COMPANY WILL REMAIN
"His Majesty" Splendidly Produced—Rex, Zana and Bill Yule All Starred.
A really excellent performance was given at the Grand Opera House Thursday night by the Rex Stock Company, which is appearing for three days in "His Majesty," a play full of funny situations. Mr. Snelgrove appears in the title role. He takes the part of a broker's stenographer, Bunker Bean, but is convinced by a fraudulent astrologer that he first appeared on earth as an Egyptian King. Eventually he finds that he has been deceived, and becomes despondent, but is finally convinced by a liberal quantity of gin that a man can become what he desires to be. And so he weds the broker's pretty daughter and finds that his stock investments have made him wealthy.
Mr. Snelgrove is at his very best in this play, and with the tipsy scene of the last act, his acting is superb. How Rex does it without real gin really mystifies the boys who could act the part in the days when you could spend a happy evening sampling various kinds of rickies.
Zana Vaughn was the broker's daughter and played her role delightfully. Rex has a charming wife to play stage love parts with, and a Rex audience likes to see these two stars in lover roles. Then there was "Bill" Yule. Of course, "Bill" was the gruff broker, and he never played a better part. William Yule is a first rank actor when he has a heavy part. Like a good violinist, he has the technique and also possesses an exceptional voice. The part he plays this week shows him at his very best. The other roles were well taken by William Seymour, Joe Kelly, Howard Brown, Charles Hannah, Florence Winters, Gloria Machan, Hazel Williams and Hazel Brown.
Between the second and third acts, Gloria Machan and Joe Kelly gave a pianologue that made a great hit with the audience. Both are clever players, and Joe had a few kid glove jokes that he slipped over on Gloria and the audience, who vigorously applauded their vaudeville act.
Mr. Snelgrove announced that the company might play in Kingston a little longer than expected. Next week might not be its last appearance here. That rested with the powers that be. However, the bill Dec. 7th, 8th, and 9th would be Cyril Maude's great play "Grumpy" featuring Rex himself. Kingston's captain does not want the Rex Stock Company to say goodbye to the Limestone City and play on another circuit. Its popularity has been as great as that of Queen's champion rugby team, and the patrons are recorded it since it came here late in August, 1921, has been remarkable. It has been producing first rank plays at popular prices, and Kingston theatregoers have been most consistent in their patronage, because of the excellence of the Rex performances.
