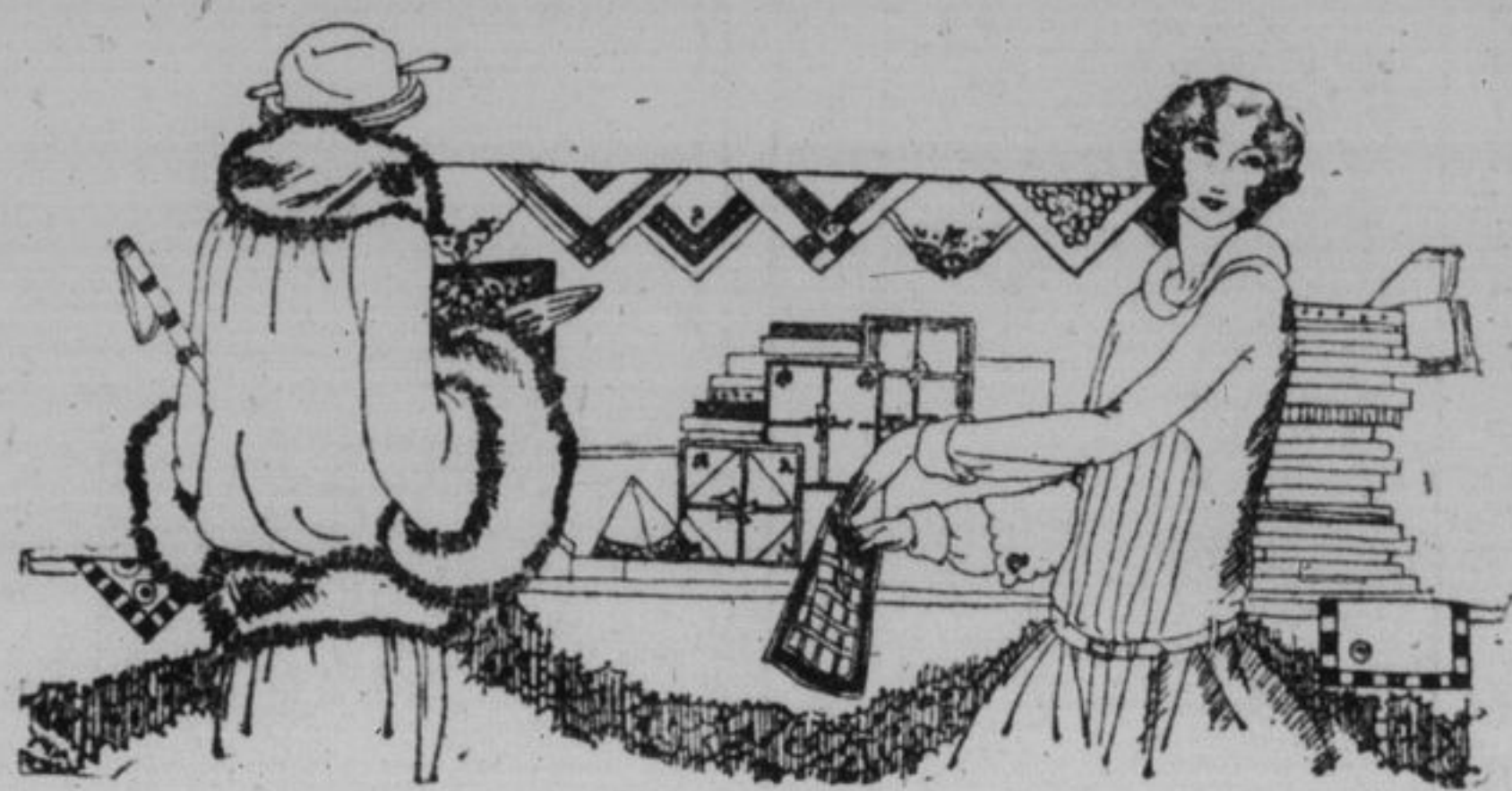

Liquor Profits for Charity. Victoria, B.C., Dec. 16.—Establishment of a provincial home for incurables has been adopted as a government policy, and a bill to that end was introduced yesterday by Hon.
