### BURGLARY COMMITTED AT G.W.V.A. CANTEN

Thirty Dollars' Worth of Goods Were Taken Early on Thursday Morning.

The canteen and poolroom of the Great War Veterans' Association was burglarized early Thursday morning, the stolen goods amounting to about \$30. Entrance was made at the back of the poolroom, by breaking a window and lifting the latch. It is believed that the unknown burglar is either a youngster, or a Simon pure amateur, anyway, as the stolen goods included eight cigarette ash-trays with the 21st Battalion crest, the remainder being cigarettes, cigars, tobacco and chocolate bars.

Fortunately, there was no money in either the cash register or a special till reserved for poolroom receipts, as this money is always kept in a safe over night and placed in the bank the following morning. There is a caretaker who sleeps on the premises, but he failed to hear the intruder.

The robbery was discovered about nine o'clock by Mr. Honeysett, an employee of the association, and he immediately notified the president at the latter's home. The police were informed and investigated the matter. The tracks of the burglar are quite visible in the snow at the back of the room, and leading up to the window, but it would appear as if the only clue lies in the 21st crests which were stolen. The thief will find some difficulty in selling these souvenirs.
