### FARMER AND DAUGHTER ARE BURNED TO DEATH They Cannot Be Produced in

A Christmas Evening Tragedy Near Brighton-Rescue Attempt Fails.

Brighton, Dec. 26 .- Christmas festivites in the home of William Firman, two miles from this village, terminated in tragedy last evening. Mr. Firman and his infant daughter were burned to death in a fire which destroyed the farm house. Mrs. Firman and a 12-year-old son escaped, but their heroic efforts to rescus the other two members of the family were unsuccessful.

Mr. Firman early in the evening fell asleep on a lounge, his little daughter sleeping beside him. The house caught fire from an overheated or defective furnace connection. It is thought that Firman, when he awoke, was immediately overcome by smoke and unable to make his escape. Meantime the wife and son, after unsuccessful attempts to save him and the child, made a difficult escape from the blazing house.




