### J. S. SIBBITT ELECTED WARDEN OF FRONTENAC

Standing Committees Appointed—They Are Reduced From Seven to Five.

John S. Sibbitt, reeve of Pittsburg township, is Frontenac's new warden. He was unanimously elected to that position by the county council at its inaugural meeting on Tuesday afternoon. When the council convened, Clerk Bradshaw called for nominations for the wardenship, and Councilor Clark moved, seconded by Councilor Gemmill, that Mr. Sibbitt be chosen. There being no other nominations the clerk declared Mr. Sibbitt elected, and the new warden was escorted to the chair by his supporters, amid applause.

Warden Sibbitt thanked his colleagues for the honor conferred upon him. He realized, however, that a big responsibility had been placed upon him, but hoped that he would prove worthy of the position he occupied. He also hoped that the council would enjoy a year of progress and that all would work together for the best interests of the county of Frontenac.

The council of 1923 is composed as follows, all being present: Warden J. S. Sibbitt, Pittsburg; Charles McGregor, Barré; David Barr, Bedford; J. E. Flake, Clarendon and Miller; John Pickett, Howe Island; R. A. Hamilton, Hinchinbrook; G. A. B. Clark and C. J. Graham, Kingston; L. D. Parks, Kennebec; William Guthrie, Loughboro; G. M. Drew, Olden; Archibald Gray, Oso; Levi Storms, Portland; James Halliday, Portsmouth; David Gemmill, Palmerston and Canoto; Samuel Jamieson, Storrington; Dr. William Spankie, Wolfe Island.

#### The New Warden.

Warden Sibbitt has been reeve of Pittsburg township for three years and served the same length of time in the county council. He was born in Pittsburg and has spent all his life there, still living on the Sibbitt homestead. He served for years on the township school board. In religion he is an Anglican, and has been a warden of St. Mark's church for sixteen years. In politics he is a Conservative. Warden Sibbitt is an ex-president of the Kingston Agricultural Association and has served six years on the Kingston Suburban Road Commission as county representative. The new warden is possessed of an affable manner and will prove himself an efficient head of the Frontenac council.

Pittsburg has given Frontenac only three wardens: Peter Graham in 1874; W. J. Franklin in 1906, and J. S. Sibbitt in 1923. Mr. Graham was an uncle of the present warden, and his portrait hangs in the council chamber to the left of the warden's platform.

#### Standing Committees.

After the installation of Warden Sibbitt, on motion of Councilors Guthrie and Storms, the following committee was appointed to choose the standing committees: Councilors Drew, Hamilton, McGregor, Halliday, Spankie, Parks and Clark. The first six named are ex-wardens. Councilor Drew reported their state as follows after an hour's recess, the first named on each committee being chairman:

Finance—Councilors Guthrie, Clark, Spankie, Drew, Halliday.  
Property—Councilors Gemmill, Halliday, Pickett, Parks, McGregor.  
Good Roads—Councilors Barr, Guthrie, Clark, Storms, Jamieson.  
Roads and Bridges—Councilors Gray, Flake, Hamilton, Parks, McGregor.

Printing and Education—Storms, Jamieson, Graham, Spankie, Barr, Quarterly Board of Audit—Councilor Hamilton.

Councilor Halliday drew attention to the fact that the select committee had not given a chairmanship to any of its number. He also pointed out that the number on the committees had been reduced from seven to five, thus reducing the expense of committee meetings.

On motion of Councilors Halliday and Hamilton the report of the select committee was adopted.

ought to make himself familiar with the profound beauties of nature that lie right at our own doors. Moreover, it ought to be the aim of all citizens to so advertise our scenery as to attract the tourist traffic. Nowhere else could tourists find such easy access to such a marvelous diversity of natural beauty, and by making this known they would come here in preference to going to more distant places. But this is not all. We have here the greatest summer climate and this, with the fishing opportunities afforded by our wonderful lakes, makes Frontenac a spot unequalled even in the Adirondacks that for many years have claimed the tourist.

The speaker told of what he saw in France where every attempt is made to take advantage of every bit of scenery, by improving roads with borders of trees. "They did this centuries ago, but even there nature has been sparing of her gifts, as it is striking fact that scenery has an important influence upon the type of men produced, and the best men come from rugged districts. This is so in France, Italy, Britain and Ireland. From the Atlantic to the Pacific Canada presents the most sublime scenery in the world, but you will find within a few miles right here in Frontenac scenery that claims the awe of all beholders. We can appreciate this only by comparing it with Switzerland where it is essentially winter scenery. On the Rhine you have summer resorts while in the south of France there are only winter resorts. In the highlands of Scotland there are summer resorts for the winter days are too short, dark and setting in at 4 p. m. England, Scotland and Ireland have their lakes and streams, and Scandinavia has its summer resorts. But in Canada you have mountains, lakes, rivers, waterfalls, rapids, torrents and forests which constitute the grandest and most diversified scenery in the world."

#### Most Beautiful Scene.

"Take the road to Kingston Mills and you will find a most beautiful view. There on a plateau, Lady Byng, the wife of our governor-general, declared the scene to be the most beautiful she had ever beheld. You can see no less than five beautiful bodies of water. Go to Kepler at the head of Loughborough Lake and will see something that far surpasses Loch Lomond. At Sydenham you will see within five miles twenty-one lakes. At Verona you will see within a few miles ten different lakes, and at Sharbot's Lake twelve lakes. Unlike Australia we have a surplus of water and you have only to glance over our maps to get an idea of the wonderful physical features that

#### Water Supply.

R. E. Burns, member of the utilities commission, gave a most interesting talk on the city's water supply and told of what the commission was doing. The matter was being carefully studied and an expert would be engaged to investigate and report on the alternative courses open to the city. He dealt with the proposal to move the plant to Ontario Park, to construct a trunk sewer around the water front and establish a filtration plant for all sewage instead of dumping it into the lake as at present and also with the proposal to bring water from Loughborough Lake. All presented engineering problems involving heavy expenditure and the best plan would be presented to the ratepayers when the time came to do so. "Perhaps," said he, "the people will not mind the flavor of the water when they are called to vote on appropriation for the work." No estimates of the cost of any of the proposals made is yet available, but the commission is working quietly and thoroughly on the water problem. It is a matter that cannot be jumped at and it will take time to determine what plan is best.
