

Baked Stuffed Onions.

Peel six large onions and parboil them until they begin to be tender. Drain and cool them slightly, then hollow them out with a sharp-edged teaspoon or sharp-edged grapefruit knife. Have ready a stuffing made of a small cupful of dry crumbs, a usual colors. When apricot satin is smart.
