It has changed hands, but was never legally deeded from Anneke Jans Bogardus' family whose equity is claimed by about 2,000 heirs. Three or four actions were brought before courts on behalf of the heirs and dishalf of the heirs of the estate of Anneke Jans Bogardus who had never signed off their equity in the property. Five of them signed the original transfer but three never did. During the intervening two or three hundred years the value of the estate town. has grown enormously and it is now sought to bring the heirs together and take corporate action to secure its apportionment.
